New South Wales Police Familiarisation Exercise

Ampol recently welcomed members of the New South Wales Police to the Kurnell Terminal on a familiarisation exercise.

The exercise was conducted to improve the overall knowledge and understanding of the Terminal, and to enhance the Police response in the event of a major incident.

Ampol Kurnell Terminal Manager, Zoe Devos, said local engagement and incident preparedness were a critical component of Terminal operations.

"We're committed to building and maintaining strong relationships with emergency response agencies and other key stakeholders in the community."

"It was great to work with the Sutherland Shire Police Area Command. We'll continue to help build their understanding of our operations and to enhance incident preparedness."

Further training exercises are planned for later in the year.



Community Notification Test

A test of the Terminal's community notification platform will be conducted at 11am on Monday 24 July.

The system provides residents and stakeholders with alerts and information in the event of a major incident at the Kurnell Terminal.

This will be a test only and no action will be required.

Residents must register their details to receive information via SMS, email or voice message. Simply scan the QR code and complete the online registration form or fill out a form which is available at the Kurnell Village Post Office.

Always working to drive the community forward, Nick has been actively involved with many projects and causes including the naming of John Weir Reserve, Captain Cook Society, Kurnell Progress and Precinct Residents Association, Sutherland Shire Kurnell Tourism Strategy Working Party and Adopt our Historic Drive Campaign.

Nick was also an active member of the Kurnell Rural Fire Service.



"The old fire tender used to leak faster than you could fill it up. So we fundraised visitors to Kurnell on the weekend and secured enough money to build a new one. It was awarded the best fire tender in all of New South Wales."

Following his retirement from the Refinery in 1984, Nick and his wife Marea (who was given the nickname Hans), spent endless time on the road exploring Australia. Nick also took up lapidary (shaping stone, minerals and gemstones), a hobby that still enjoys today.

Unfortunately, Hans suffered a major stroke and required full time care.

"When you get married you say for better or for worse. I used to visit her every day in the nursing home, but I knew she wanted to come home to Kurnell."

"The best thing I did in my life was to care for my beautiful wife."
