Stormwater management

Two new stormwater pump stations have now been commissioned and are fully operational as required. Consisting of both electric and diesel pumps, the electric pumps have the capability to pump up to 1,000,000 litres of water per hour.



Construction of the final two pump stations will commence in January 2025 and be completed by mid year.

Work to reline stormwater pipes and pits that flow to the drain outlet at Silver Beach has now been completed. Monitoring of flows through this pipeline is being conducted to validate effectiveness.

Odour mitigation

Installation of new odour mitigation units have been completed around the Waste Water Treatment Plant and is continuing in the north-east corner of the Terminal. These units will be commissioned for operations in early 2025.

The removal of waste material from the retention basin has now been completed and preparation for the installation of permanent new covers is being conducted. The project is on track to be completed by early next year.

Ampol Proudly Powering the Kurnell Santa Run

Following an oily water overflow incident in April 2022, Ampol implemented an investigation at the request of the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA), to assess the potential immediate and longterm impact on surrounding ecological communities.

The Ecological Impact Assessment (EIA) was undertaken by independent environment consultants, WSP, and consisted of sampling of soils, sediment, water quality and vegetation monitoring events, and aquatic toxicity testing.

Samples underwent laboratory testing and analysis, and data collected represented more than a year of assessments and observations from locations including Marton Park, Captain Cook Drive channel, and Quibray Bay wetlands.

The results of the EIA study concluded there to be no long-term impact on the ecological communities in the areas described above. It recognised in the time immediately after the incident, there was potential for some adverse effects on ecology, however affected ecology was able to recover and recolonise.

The report has been submitted to the EPA.





Terminal siren

Our siren is tested everyday at 12noon with a 1 x 10 second blast, and 2 x 10 second blasts on Mondays.

The siren is for on-site personnel only and people in the community do not need to take action.

In the event of a major incident that has potential to impact the community, Ampol will provide initial alerts and information via its community notification platform. Residents are advised to always follow any direction from emergency services.
